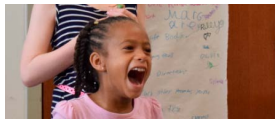
The Theatre Lab is Washington's largest theatre school.

We teach beginners and professionals, youth and adults, and people the arts rarely reach.



Our faculty is exceptional.

Our curriculum is taught by a distinguished faculty of more than 40 instructors—all of whom are respected actors, directors, or playwrights working in Washington's professional theatre community.



Accessibility is central to our mission.

We distribute more than \$130,000 in scholarships each year so that disadvantaged adults and youth can experience the artistic and real-life benefits of high-quality theatre education.



We bring arts to people in need.

Our Life Stories outreach program teaches incarcerated and vulnerable youth, homeless women in recovery, older adults, wounded veterans, and more to create original dramatic works based on their life experiences.



Our programs are nationally recognized.

The President's Committee on the Arts and Humanities has recognized The Theatre Lab as one of the 50 "top arts- and humanities-based programs in the country serving youth beyond school hours."

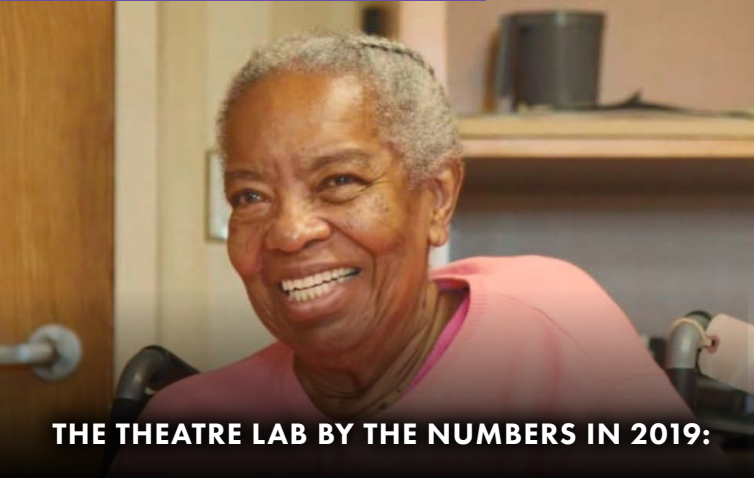


Our students are successful.
