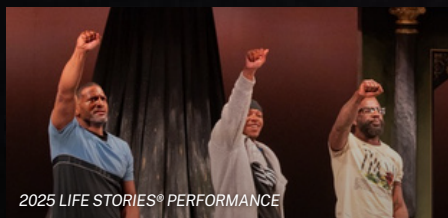

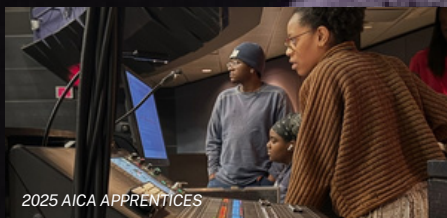

LIFE STORIES®

Life Stories® is The Theatre Lab's **award-winning, tuition-free outreach program** that has helped over 4,000 individuals create original works based on their lived experiences — including incarcerated and vulnerable youth, women in recovery experiencing homelessness, veterans, LGBTQ+ adults, and more.

ARTS INSTITUTE FOR CREATIVE ADVANCEMENT

The Arts Institute for Creative Advancement (AICA) is a **year-long paid technical theatre apprenticeship program*** that provides intensive education, hands-on training, and work experience for young adults facing barriers to livable-wage careers, preparing them for employment as professional theatre technicians in DC.

YOUTH CAMPS & SCHOOL YEAR CLASSES

The President's Committee on the Arts and Humanities has recognized The Theatre Lab as one of the **50 "top arts- and humanities-based programs in the country serving youth beyond school hours."** Each summer, we are the artistic home to over 550 young people in the DC region who take part in our acclaimed theatre camps.

TEEN TRAINING INSTITUTES

Our renowned summer teen training institutes are among the **best teen theatre programs in DC** — producing alums of Juilliard, NYU Tisch, Carnegie Mellon, and more. The Musical Theatre Institute for Teens (MTIT), our flagship program, consistently plays to rave critical reviews and sold-out houses at DC's Atlas Performing Arts Center.

ADULT CLASSES & WORKSHOPS

We offer a comprehensive dramatic arts curriculum taught by a **distinguished faculty** of over 50 respected actors, directors, and playwrights working in the DMV's professional theatre community. Our classes are carefully designed to fit all skills, backgrounds, and experience levels, with an **unparalleled teacher-to-student ratio**.

HONORS ACTING CONSERVATORY

The Honors Acting Conservatory is an **intensive, one-year professional actor training** program. Our Honors Alumni act in professional productions at many of the best theaters in the DC region, including Arena Stage, Constellation Theatre, The Keegan Theatre, Mosaic Theatre, Round House Theatre, Studio Theatre, and more.

In 2025, we've awarded **\$171,000+** in scholarships — our biggest year of giving yet — to ensure we can support as many families in our community as possible. We welcomed a record-breaking **550 young people** into this year's summer programs, our largest camp enrollment season to date.

THE WORKFORCE OF TOMORROW

The Theatre Lab proudly co-leads the AICA, a groundbreaking workforce development program for young adults. **Over 84% of our AICA graduates are steadily employed** as theatre technical professionals at leading performing arts and entertainment venues in the DMV.

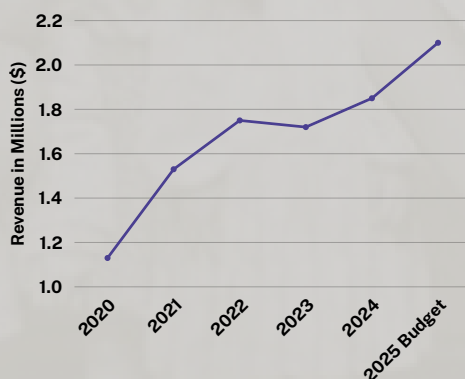
